About the ITC Mughal

This hotel – named after the dynasty who built the Taj Mahal nearby – is a celebration of the Mughals, evidenced immediately by the lofty interiors and the rectangular water bodies and fountains in the 35-acre gardens. From its roof terrace, one can also spot the Taj Mahal.

The garden is a surprise: neatly laid out with butterfly garden, table tennis, air hockey, lawn tennis, badminton, jogging track and dirt bikes in amongst the lawns, water bodies and fountains. If you look carefully, you'll find 30 pomegranate trees, too – a favourite fruit of the Mughals.

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The 24-hour Taj Bano serves buffet-style meals, with a 'chaat' street food station and one indigenous 'local love' dish served every day. Breakfast here is comprehensive with almost too much choice. Try sweet 'jalebi' or lentil puri (puffed bread) with potato gravy. Peshawri is the gourmet evening draw, based on the world-famous Bukhara in Delhi, serving North West Frontier food – with open-view kitchen and just 10 main items on the menu.
